Coming Up:

This week, in **Reading**, we started our Fantasy Unit. Students will be "reading" (listening to) *The Thief of Always* by Clive Barker. Thanks to Mr.



Barry, we have the audio book, narrated by Adam Verner. Mrs. Countryman, Ms. Mastrangelo, and Ms. Mayone-Allison were treated to a meeting with both Mr. Verner and

Mr. Barry today. They will be our featured guests at next week's Reading Circle "Hang Outs" on Tuesday (06/02) – homerooms 6B/6KL meet at 1:00; homerooms 6D/6M meet at 1:30. Students will have an opportunity to chat with both of these professional narrators.

For this unit, students will be listening to two chapters *every day*, and reflecting on what they read. There will also be short video lessons that will help students navigate this complex genre!

In **Math**, students are working on statistics. They are learning there are many averages to explore – mean, median, mode and range. The true test is which one to use, and when. In **Writing**, students are finishing their research projects and working on an end-of-year writing

piece. **Science** continues to be an exploration of our outdoor world. Mrs. Kuhne reports that in **Social Studies**, the unit on Egypt is just about *wrapped up*!
